#### II. BACKGROUND

The National Commission for Lebanese Women (NCLW) is the National Women Machinery and is an official institution affiliated to the Presidency of the Council of Ministers. NCLW was established by law in 1998 to promote women's rights in Lebanese society and enhance gender mainstreaming in public institutions.

Since 2006, the National Commission for Lebanese Women (NCLW) has been collaborating with the United Nations Population Fund (UNFPA) towards mainstreaming gender aspects in various development platforms, policies, and strategies.

In 2025, NCLW will be working in close collaboration with UNFPA on a list of activities and interventions to eliminate gender-based violence and promote gender equality.

The Project in collaboration with UNFPA will consist of the following key interventions:

## Implementation of the Sexual Harassment Law:

a) Dissemination and roll out of the "Self-learning online training courses on sexual harassment" in the workplace.

#### **Gender Based-Violence**

a) Developing and releasing a National Platform for Gender Based Violence Data Collection, Storage, and Analysis under the Lebanon National Gender Observatory (GBV-LNGO).

The Web Expert-Firm will be responsible for designing, developing and releasing a National Platform for GBV Data Collection, Storage, and Analysis under the Lebanon National Gender Observatory (GBV-LNGO).

## III. FUNCTIONS AND TASKS

The following tasks will be expected of the Web Expert-Firm:

- Design, develop, and release a secure and user-friendly web-based National Platform for GBV Data Collection, Storage, and Analysis under the Lebanon National Gender Observatory (GBV-LNGO) in both Arabic and English.
- Coordinate with the GBV Expert who will be developing the content of the platform, and implement the modules, structure, content, and framework of the platform.
- Design the layout and create the visual design (including dashboard) of the platform by integrating the data collection tools, indicators, reporting forms, and other content provided by the GBV Expert.
- Provide handover package, including technical documentation, user manuals, and training materials for stakeholders and end-users in Arabic and English.
- Provide functionality, usability, security, and performance testing, and pilot the platform with NCLW.
- Ensure the compliance of the platform with GBV data ethical standards (confidentiality, do no harm...).
- Ensure the platform can export data for reporting and analysis.
- Apply NCLW branding guidelines and ensure their compliance.
- Establish a sustainability and handover plan to ensure long-term use and management of the platform.
- Integrate NCLW's comments and feedback, as well as to back-and-forth revisions.
- Guide and train the NCLW team on how to use and manage the platform through the web hosting needs and security setups/ controls.
- Be flexible and responsive to the services requested as well as provide innovative ideas and recommendations, and serve as a resource for problem analysis and solution.

The website design must be secured and should be adhered to the security best practices.
