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## Foreword

The National Action Plan 2024-2026 aims to implement the National Strategy for Women in Lebanon 2022-2030, and it is the result of a collaborative work between the National Commission for Lebanese Women (NCLW) and its partners, with the support of the United Nations Population Fund (UNFPA).

The activities that will be carried out during the three-year period of the Plan were identified during 21 discussion meetings, each of which included 20 to 25 participants from various ministries, public departments, international organizations, communities, academic institutions, unions, and political parties. Thus, this Plan, as well as the Strategy, acquired a national character, first because they represent a joint collaboration between institutions from the public and private sectors, and second, because they are designed for comprehensive implementation across all regions and aim to reach women from diverse social groups.

We must point out the delicate economic conditions that accompanied the process of this Plan's development and the difficult financial conditions suffered by the public sector institutions that are supposed to be responsible for implementing the Plan in cooperation with international stakeholders and civil society organizations.

It is expected that the availability of the financial resources required to complete the observed activities will constitute the first challenge in the implementation of the Plan and the Strategy. Therefore, overcoming this challenge in the foreseeable future will depend on the support provided by donors to public and private sector institutions. Coordination with these stakeholders is essential to be able to complete the activities mentioned

in the Plan in the next stage. In addition, the efforts that will be made to gain the support of ministers and senior officials and ensure their commitment to the objectives of the Strategy and achieve the expected impacts of its activities are also considered essential for the Plan's success.

Given the complexity of issues influencing the success of efforts aimed at enhancing the status of women in society and achieving equality, success in implementing this Plan requires close and ongoing collaboration between official entities on one hand and between these entities, relevant international entities, and civil society organizations on the other hand. This collaboration should persist throughout the implementation period of any activities and even after their completion, aiming to assess the success of initiatives and leverage lessons learned from experiences for future endeavors.

Last but not least, achieving the expected impact of this Plan's implementation and, consequently, realizing the objectives of the National Strategy for Women in Lebanon requires a commitment founded on personal conviction from all women and men involved in the practical execution of the Plan. This commitment should be grounded in the legitimacy of the principles that form the foundation of the Strategy and the essential nature of the objectives it aims to accomplish.

The ultimate goal is to achieve the building of a society based on healthy relationships among its individuals, both women and men, and the construction of a just State that safeguards the rights of citizens, providing them with a peaceful life.

All participants in the development of the National Plan 2024 - 2026 for the implementation of the National Strategy for Women in Lebanon distinguished themselves through their commitment and dedication. They all deserve gratitude and appreciation, and we especially thank the United Nations Population Fund (UNFPA), which provided the necessary support to formulate this Plan.

## 1- Introduction

This Work Plan was drafted to achieve the objectives outlined in the National Strategy for Women in Lebanon 2022-2030. The Plan comprises a variety of activities designed to yield outcomes that actively contribute to the attainment of these objectives and it constitutes a method that allows all governmental and community agencies concerned in women and equality issues to effectively guide activities and actions ensuring the attainment of the desired outcomes. Hence, like the Strategy, the Work Plan is a product of collaborative efforts among the stakeholders involved in the implementation of tasks aimed at realizing the five main strategic objectives. The coordination of these endeavors is overseen by the National Commission for Lebanese Women (NCLW).

The activities outlined in this Plan reflect the policies approved by the stakeholders for implementation in alignment with the Strategy. These initiatives have an impact on women across various social groups, encompassing marginalized communities, including those with disabilities (physical, sensory, and mental), elderly women, refugees, displaced women, foreign workers, undocumented women, female prisoners, and others.

The Plan will be implemented between 2024 and 2026 inclusive, and shall be followed by a second complementary plan that must be implemented during 2027-2030.

For the 2024-2026 period, the participants in drafting the Action Plan agreed to choose activities that would lead to results that will help achieve the strategic objectives if implemented

during the adopted timeframe. This Plan also listed various interventions incorporated in the plans and work programs adopted in the ministries and departments concerned with implementing the National Strategy for Women in Lebanon (2022-2030), and included interventions approved by these stakeholders before the year 2024 and whose implementation period has not yet expired.

In addition, and pursuant to the concluding observations issued by the Committee on the Elimination of All Forms of Discrimination against Women at the United Nations (The CEDAW Committee), and after discussing the sixth national report submitted by Lebanon on the implementation of the CEDAW convention in the year 2022, the recommendations mentioned by the Committee were included in its comments to the Action Plan. It should be noted that Lebanon, which is committed under the CEDAW treaty to submit periodic reports to the relevant UN Committee on the implementation of the provisions of the treaty, is invited to submit its seventh report to the Committee in February 2026.

It is important to note that the International Committee attached to its request to Lebanon for the adoption of the recommendations outlined in its observations, a recommendation to strengthen the technical assistance provided by United Nations agencies for this purpose.

The participants involved in crafting this Action Plan also reached a consensus to identify the activities, considering the available capabilities throughout the duration of the Plan, and given

that the country is currently suffering from an economic and financial crisis that negatively impacts the activity of public agencies and non-governmental organizations. Therefore, the success of national development initiatives requires close cooperation with international institutions concerned with development.

To ensure the effective implementation of the activities outlined in the Plan, the participants involved in its development emphasized the importance of aligning interventions with clearly defined subjects and implementation periods (spanning three years). They stressed the need for proportionality to the desired results and the capacity to both execute and measure the outcomes of the anticipated activities.

## 2- Methodology

After the completion and launch of the National Strategy for Women in Lebanon (2022-2030), the interest of the participants in its development focused on setting a Work Plan for it in the coming years. With the support of the United Nations Population Fund, the National Commission for Lebanese Women (NCLW) took on the task of outlining and drafting this plan, and in cooperation with its partners, organized 21 discussion meetings, where each aimed at identifying the interventions that should be included in the Action Plan to achieve the main strategic objectives of the Strategy during 2024-2026, based on a first draft of the Plan.

For each proposed activity, the stakeholder responsible for implementation and the stakeholders likely to cooperate with it were identified according to their categories. Indicators that allow monitoring the implementation of the activity were also identified. The activities were classified according to the main objectives of the Strategy, and were listed under headings indicating the desired results to be achieved in order to achieve the sub-objectives stated in the Strategy, which are: "The expected impacts of the activities," the number of which has been limited to 15 expected impacts:

- Expanding the scope of knowledge regarding the phenomenon of violence against women and institutionalizing data analysis.
- Preventing violence against women and girls, spreading awareness, and providing support and services to survivors.
- Providing an integrated and institutional protection system for women and girl survivors.

- Reducing poverty prevalence among women and ensuring they benefit from the development of the social protection system.
- Providing health awareness, preventive and care services to women.
- Updating educational curricula and teaching methods and promoting the culture of human rights and acceptance of others.
- Empowering students to confront exposure to violence, and providing them with means of protection, and reducing school dropout cases.
- Developing women's personal capabilities in the economic field.
- Providing legislative and administrative provisions and creating socio-economic conditions conducive to women's participation in economic life.
- Developing the personal and technical capabilities of women in leadership.
- Adopting legislation and measures supporting women's participation in national and local political, administrative, economic, and development decisions.
- Removing discriminatory provisions against women from laws and adopting a legislative policy that supports their rights.
- Strengthening the network of officers specializing in gender-based social roles in official departments.
- Promoting a culture of human rights in decision-making and implementation processes.
- Promoting a culture of human rights in universities, on the media and social media and encouraging cultural works that involve positive aspects of masculinity and femininity.

### **3- Risks That May Hinder The Implementation Of These Activities**

The participants in the drafting of this Plan are aware that there is a high possibility that the implementation of the activities included will encounter obstacles that may prevent carrying them out. In the current economic crisis and political instability, there is an increase of risks that could paralyze the developmental initiatives represented by these interventions in any field.

In view of the fact that most of these risks are linked in one way or another to the general situation, the participants in the development of the Plan preferred to address the issue of risks in a general manner. The treatment of the difficulties and obstacles that may hinder carrying out a specific activity was left to those responsible for its implementation, who would find the most appropriate solution to address any urgent challenge.

The potential general risks that threaten the implementation of the interventions are:

- The occurrence of security disturbances.
- The stoppage of work in public administrations due to the deteriorating living conditions of their workers.
- The disabling of decision-making and initiative mechanisms within these departments.
- The lack of data and information necessary to carry out the intervention.
- The lack of necessary human and financial resources to carry out the intervention.
- The reluctance of decision-makers to respond to the work requirements for achieving gender equality, or their rejection and denouncement of the principle of equality between women and men.

- The unwillingness of the targeted individuals involved in the intervention to reach the desired result of the implementation.

In anticipation of the occurrence of these risks and other difficulties that may hinder the implementation of interventions, the participants in the Plan development recognized that addressing potential risks, whether associated with the general situation or specific interventions, could be effectively managed by focusing on the following:

- Resorting to conflict resolution techniques and disseminating knowledge regarding these techniques.
- Strengthening awareness campaigns to highlight the community's benefits from the interventions outlined in the Plan.
- Establishing cooperation between public administration agencies and civil society organizations, and ensuring that there are multiple entities responsible for interventions aimed at achieving a specific desired result.
- Collaborating with donors financing a specific intervention by promptly sharing challenges encountered during early-stage implementation, working together to address these challenges, and ensuring adherence to principles of financial transparency in the process.
- Developing methods to gain the support of decision-makers and target audiences based on objective data.
- Reconsidering the adoption of a specific activity when it becomes clear that it is impossible to overcome the existing obstacles to its implementation and redirecting the funding allocated to it to another intervention.



## **First Main Objective**

Violence against women and girls is socially rejected and legally prohibited, and protection and assistance to survivors are available in terms of security, judicial interventions, as well as materially and psychologically, while psychological rehabilitation is available to the perpetrators.

### **First sub-objective:**

Expanding knowledge about the data surrounding the occurrence of cases of violence and the incidence of violence against women and girls.

#### **Expected impact:**

Expanding the scope of knowledge regarding the phenomenon of violence against women and girls and institutionalizing data analysis
